### General

Membership of CNet is FREE - as a member of CNet you will receive:

- Regular information via e-bulletin including details of current funding schemes, events, training courses, vacancies and forum news
- Discount on CNet room hire charges
- News of opportunities to get involved in shaping the future of the district via forum activities, community representation roles and consultations
- Latest news about the Bradford District Assembly and the voluntary and community sector forums
- Information about networking events and opportunities relevant to your group or organisation

#### **Categories of Membership\***

Membership of CNet is open to:

- any voluntary & community sector (VCS) group or organisation operating in the Bradford district
- any individual who lives or works in the Bradford district

There are four categories of membership as follows:

- 1. Community VCS groups with no paid employees, just volunteers
- 2. Voluntary VCS groups with paid employees with or without volunteers
- 3. Community of Interest VCS groups working with either a) communities who share an identity (e.g. an ethnic identity) or b) communities who share an experience or concern (e.g. carers, refugees & asylum seekers)
- 4. Individual to have individual membership you must live or work in Bradford district and have a clear interest / involvement in the VCS and in the work of CNet

# Bradford District VCS Assembly & VCS Forums

The Bradford District Assembly and the VCS forums provide a link between strategic bodies in the public sector (e.g. Bradford Council) and the voluntary & community sector.

#### Bradford District Partnership

The Bradford District Partnership (BDP) is coordinated by Bradford Council and it is the Local Strategic Partnership for the Bradford District. BDP is the key body that brings together the public, private, voluntary and community sectors with the aim to improve the quality of life for the district's residents. BDP coordinates and supports the work of the partners and partnerships across the district. These partners share responsibility for making sure that the district's (Sustainable) Community Strategy improves the quality of life and wellbeing of the people of the district.

The BDP has adopted a flexible governance structure which consists of core and flexible components. The core components include the BDP Executive Board, Partnership Summits, Virtual Leadership Group and the Statutory Partnerships (e.g. the Children's Trust, Community Safety Partnership and support to the Health & Wellbeing Board through the Health Improvement Partnership), whilst the flexible components include non-statutory partnerships, professional networks and forums such as the Bradford District Assembly.

#### How do the VCS forums relate to the BDP and other strategic bodies?

The Bradford District Assembly VCS forums are networks of voluntary and community sector organisations who work in each of the following areas:

- Young Lives Bradford (children & young people)
- Health & Wellbeing Forum
- Community Economic Forum
- Safer Communities Third Sector Network
- Equalities Forum

The forums have links and influence with the BDP and other strategic bodies through forum representatives who sit on the different boards and strategy groups. Forum representatives act as a communication channel - taking issues from the VCS through the forums to these strategic levels and feeding information back to the forums.
