

## ICB minutes for HWBB 19<sup>th</sup> July 2019

### *Check-in*

3 CCGs - two outstanding and one good. Helen Hirst thinks the CQC ratings will change so things will be different next year.

Mel Pickup will be the new CEO for Bradford Teaching Hospitals Foundation Trust (BTHFT) and the new system lead for Bradford (expect mid-November start).

Experience includes Cheshire and Merseyside STP Lead.

Industrial Action at BTHFT is not great at the moment. Setting up a wholly owned subsidiary for non-clinical work (estates, cleaning etc). This is strategic move to support the future. Action likely to continue until October – please support the hospital where you can by encouraging communities to think about A&E attendance during action weeks.

Capital and estates conversation required for Bradford Place so we can funnel into ICS level things.

Beckfield Care Home – rated outstanding – now have 4 outstanding care homes in Bradford.

### *Workforce strategy update*

The meeting received an update on the workforce strategy and progress against tasks to date. The presentation can be circulated if people are interested but was not supplied with the agenda papers so I need to get hold of it.

### *Unpaid Carers Programme (West Yorkshire and Harrogate Health and Care Partnership (WYH HCP) and Bradford & District)*

The meeting received a presentation on carers work locally and WYH HCP.
