WHAT IS HATE CRIME?

A hate crime is any offence committed because a person is seen to be different because of their:

- **Disability**
- **Gender or Gender Identity**
- **Race, Ethnicity or Nationality**
- **Religion, Faith or Belief**
- **Sexual Orientation**
- **Alternative Sub Cultures**

DEFINITION OF HATE CRIME

Any criminal offence perceived by the victim or any other person to be motivated by hostility or prejudice based on person's race, perceived race, religion, perceived religion, sexual orientation, perceived sexual orientation, transgender, perceived transgender, disability, perceived disability.

**HOW MANY HATE CRIMES
WERE THERE IN 2017/8?**

HATE CRIME STATISTICS 2017/18

In 2017/18, there were 96,098 hate crime offences recorded by the police in England and Wales, an increase of 17% compared with the previous year.

71,251 (76%) race hate crimes;
11,638 (12%) sexual orientation hate crimes;
8,336 (9%) religious hate crimes;
7,226 (8%) disability hate crimes; and
1,651 (2%) transgender hate crimes.

It is possible for a hate crime offence to have more than one motivating factor which is why the above numbers sum to more than 94,098 and the proportions to more than 100 per cent.

EFFECTS ON MENTAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH

A victim of any crime will have psychological and mental health impact.

"...the more someone feels targeted by racist actions and behaviours the greater the damage to their mental health. This includes increased likelihood to develop chronic depression, anxiety and psychological distress."

MENTAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH CONSEQUENCES CONT.

“Citizens who experience hate crime and incidents can suffer stress, anger and distress for longer than a crime that is not related to their characteristics.

Survivors are likely to feel more vulnerable after the experience and see the world as more dangerous, unpredictable and hostile.”

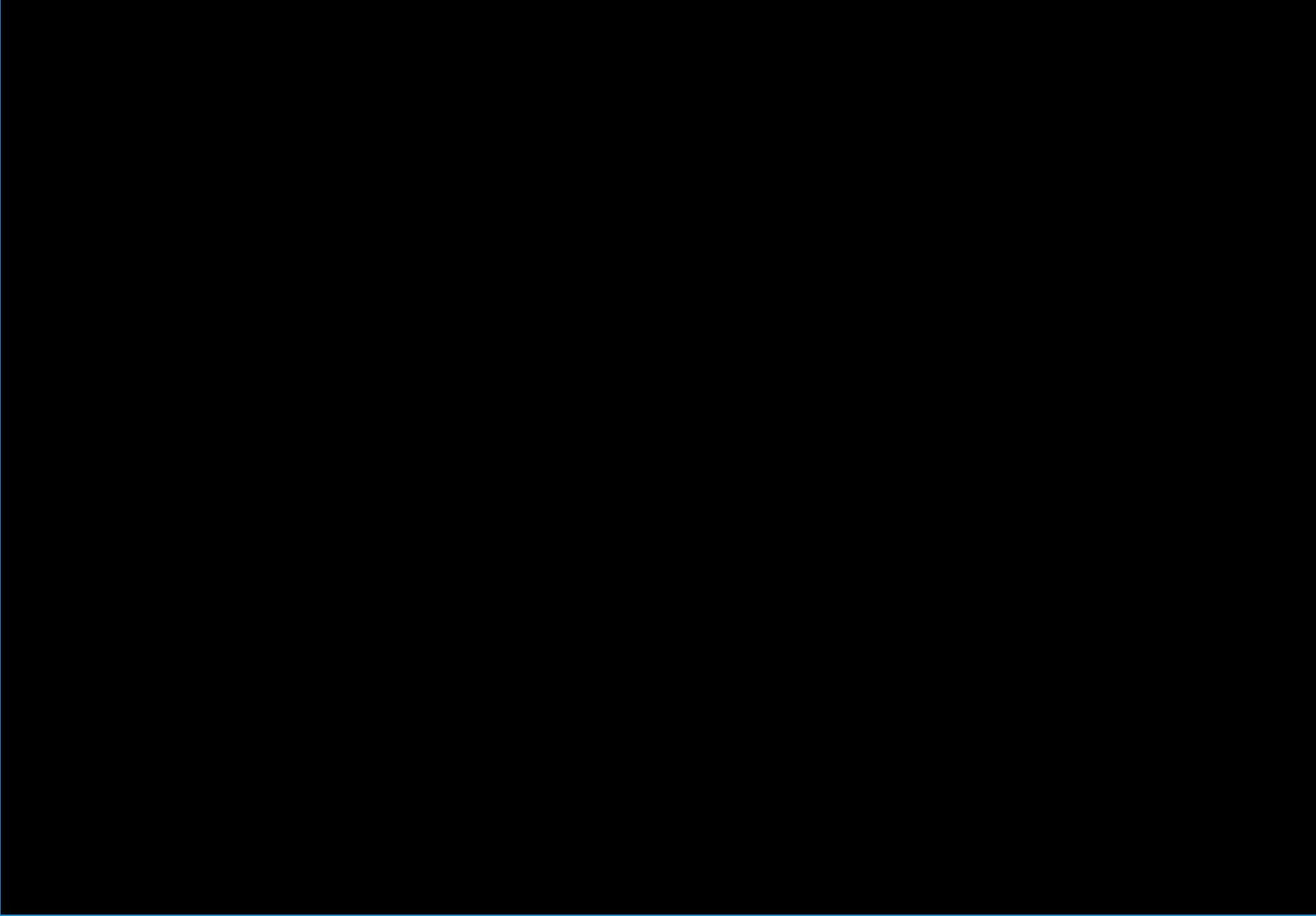
