1.	Welcome / Introductions/Apologies Aliya chaired the meeting; Aliya welcomed everyone and thanked everyone for attending. Introductions were made.	
2.	Minutes of the last meeting and Matters Arising Minutes were agreed as correct and actions were discussed.	

## 3. Updates

#### **Sara Hollins (Bradford Royal Infirmary)**

Sara explained that at present all women may have one birth partner present during their stay on the labour ward. The maternity teams should know post July 19<sup>th</sup> what the guidance will be in relation to visiting rights in the rest of the organization, ensuring a secure Covid safe visiting policy for mothers, babies and families.

### Ockenden Report

The Ockenden assurance evidence has now been submitted and will be looked at by the Regional Chief Midwifery Officer's team before going on to the National level. Site visits will take place and be classed as a layer of assurance to keep in line with procedures stated within the report.

### 15 Step Review

Sara fedback that- they were now in the process of looking at the perfect birth room, and rolling this out however they were being restricted by funds and costings. They were looking for any supporting organisation, or local businesses that may be able to support with funds or soft furnishings etc.

It was suggested that disability and access be considered for service users to be part of the review team. (To look at incorporating within the next 15 step review)

Birmingham Symptoms Specific Obstetrician Triage System
BSSOTS was implemented as a result of two serious incidents in 2020. As a result all
women in the triage, within the 15 minutes of arrival in the maternity assessment center
are put in a traffic light system. So those falling into the red category are immediately
transferred to the labour ward as they are considered as needing urgent assistance. If

anyone falls into amber then there is a timescale within which they need to be seen. For those falling under the green will be seen however more acutely

#### The Theatre Build

The theatre build is in progress, expecting an impact on the service from August 2021 onwards, whereby it will become quite noisy due to workmen and building work. Support will be required from the MVP in communicating to women what to expect when they visit stay in the unit during this period.

## **Equality & Diversity**

Sara requested from the members their thoughts and opinions on what pronouns should be used within the maternity services around women/people/gender identity, as a means of ensuring equality for all persons and user groups.

### **Holly Vincent & Sarah Simpson (Airedale General)**

Ockenden assurance evidence was submitted on 30/06/21. Lots of work is still being carried out to ensure Airedale General is providing safe care for women.

#### Continuity of care

Holly and Sarah feedback they have completed the consultation period at Airedale and as a result identified the core staff needed. The next team they hope to introduce is the Jasmin Team around September/October 2021. With the two present teams the continuity of care is approximately at 16-20%. This is under the target they need to be at but are with a hindered by the lack of staff. With the next team in place they envisage to not only reach

this target but to exceed it. Vacancies have been advertised but have seen a low uptake.

#### 15 Steps Review

A review was scheduled for 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2021 however this was postponed and will be rearranged as soon as possible.

#### **Breastfeeding Buddies**

Informed they were reviewing how best to get back to visiting face to face. There is a new Breastfeeding Buddies peer support group in Buttershaw, on Fridays from 10.30 – 12.00pm. Places will need to be booked. They are also considering starting a peer support group in Silsden.

#### LMS update

After Thought Service is a debrief service for women who may need to discuss what their birth experience were like, PTSD symptoms etc. Airedale has some PMA's whom can provide this service.

A query was raised regarding funding services similar to the above mentioned in clinical settings

Ruth Shaw explained that the CCG will not be responsible for funding these, as providers are to identify gaps and needs within their services and are responsible for funding what is required.

Ruth also mentioned that Bradford District and Craven CCG will cease to exist from March 2022, to be replaced by the new Integrated Care System, which will not be a statutory body.
