Child Friendly Status - Kate Lightstead Kate introduced herself and went through a Powerpoint Presentation (link) Key points and answers to questions: Logos/badges will be disseminated once launched • How much does the programme influence the enforcement of children's rights? UNICEF are looking at progression and show that we have moved forward. Educating and empowering people to be aware of rights • How does it link in with basic human rights and justice for children? All aspects of civil society are covered • As a VCS what is the most valuable thing we can do together in terms of service delivery organisations embedding principles in a consistent way? Contributing to the discovery phase initially, have a young people and children guarantee, develop tools together to enable young peoples voice to be head and have an impact, build in children's rights to what you do. Training will be offered to help with consistency • JK raised concerns over accountability and measuring since Brexit. Will it have any real power and who is it accountable to?

Safer event to be held online soon. Presented proposed SCP plan with high level objectives. Community Partnerships: BC: potential change to Community Partnerships workshops took place – much talk about CP's being asked to do wider system delivery, resources not confirmed yet, could be significant changes in terms of service delivery and system thinking. May mean we have local solutions to local issues. CS added need to strengthen Anchors in the light of these changes. These may need to be reviewed.

DEVELOPING OUR VOICE - WYCA/ICS/ICP pathways for voice and influence are not clear, with system decisions being made behind closed doors.

COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIP - Commissioners do not using the available 'vehicles' within the local VCS to ensure they use locally based organisations first.

COLLABORATION AND PARTNERSHIP - The created funding environment (including a lack of transparency) incentivises competition over collaboration, and value for money over sustainability, leading to a breakdown in trust.

ACHIEVING SUSTAINABILITY - An acknowledgement of the value of VCS preventative services and grassroot engagement, leads to increased demand which is not backed up with adequate long-term funding assurance.

BUILDING VCS CAPACITY AND RESILIENCE - Breakdown of relationships between key providers.
